- ensure that end of life care remains a high priority for the RCGP, consolidating the work already undertaken and building for the future

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Programme update for 2014/15

RCGP end of life care survey

Our survey explored the experiences of general practice professionals in delivering end of life care.

- 654 professionals responded to the survey.
- Core areas explored included educational needs; delivering care; communication; and 24/7 access.
- 97% of respondents agreed that general practice plays a key role in delivering end of life care to patients and families.

The survey highlights the continued dedication of general practitioners in supporting people and their families in the last years of life. It describes many of the fundamental challenges and success factors that impact GPs' ability to provide this care. We hope to publish the formal anonymised analysis later this year. Masterclass in end of life care

We delivered five one-day end of life Masterclass events around the UK, providing 150 professionals with key updates on delivering the best care to patients and their families at the end of life. Topics included prescribing at the end of life; palliative care emergencies; pain and symptom control; advance care planning; fluids and nutrition at the end of life and GMC guidance; recognising a patient is entering the last stage of life; and anticipatory care planning.
