Your guide to hosting a successful Great Daffodil Appeal fundraiser



Thanks for holding a bingo session for Marie Curie. Here's what you need to score a fundraising full house. And the real prize? The money you raise will help provide more expert end of life care and support.

Set the date, location and entry fee

Hold your bingo night at home, at your club or community group base, at work, or even in your local pub (with the landlord's agreement).

Boost your fundraising

Set up a [JustGiving](#) page to share your plans and collect entry fees. Add a target, photo and why you're supporting Marie Curie to supercharge your fundraising by up to 40%. Tell your workplace too – some will match your total or donate. If you're holding it at a pub, ask the landlord to invite suppliers along!

Don't forget the prizes

Ask contacts and local businesses if they could provide prizes.

Spread the word

Let everyone know about your fundraiser on social media, WhatsApp groups and email, asking people to sign up. Include your [JustGiving](#) link. If relevant ask the venue manager to share details with suppliers too. You can also download posters, invitations and social media tiles.

Bingo time!

We've got your bingo cards to download and print (remember some spares for extra attendees). And don't forget the bunting to make your venue look extra Great Daffodil Appeal-ing. Place your fundraising page details on tables to encourage extra donations too.

Bank your donations

Pay in any cash donations by phone on 0800 716 146. Or send a cheque to Marie Curie Supporter Relations Team, PO Box 23897, 14 Links Place, Edinburgh EH6 9AB. Please include a note with your full name and how the funds were raised, so that we can acknowledge receipt.

The finishing touches

Add offline donations to your online fundraising page total so your supporters can see how much you've raised. And don't forget to thank them and let them know what a difference they're making.
