Care for people affected by terminal illness in your constituency

Every year around 110,000 people affected by terminal illness in the UK don't get the care and support they need.

For people with a terminal illness, getting the right care and support can sometimes be difficult. Research commissioned by Marie Curie has shown that:

- People who miss out on care are often those with a non-cancer diagnosis or those over the age of 85, while people from deprived areas and black and minority ethnic communities often report poorer quality of care;
- 7 out of 10 carers say that people with a terminal illness don't get all the care and support they need; and
- Only 15% of health and social care professionals think that people with a terminal illness have their care needs adequately met by A&E services.

Across the UK, people with a terminal illness and their families are missing out on care and support they need simply because of their personal circumstances or where they live. We don't think this is fair

This is an issue that will affect many of your constituents, but there are ways to improve the situation locally:

- Ask your local Health and Wellbeing Board if their health and wellbeing strategy
 includes improving access to and quality of palliative care for people with a terminal
 illness. Currently only 43% of England's Health and Wellbeing Boards have addressed the
 needs of people affected by terminal illness in their strategies.
- Check if your local authority allows fast-track access for social care for people with a terminal illness. People can wait 30 days and even longer to get social care. Some even die in hospital while they wait. The Care Act 2014 gives local authorities the power to end this situation through fast-track options for people who have a terminal illness.
- Ask your local Trust and CCG what support is available for people affected by terminal illness out of hours. Just 3% of Trusts in England provide access to specialist palliative care consultants on a 24/7 basis and many carers feel they only have the emergency services to turn to when they need support.



Marie Curie is here to help.
